If you don't have any of those items with you, you can also use your voter registration card, a school ID, a utility bill, a bank statement, or any government document with your name and address printed on it. With these items, you will be required to sign a form stating that you understand that you need to provide one of the initially listed items in the future.

If you don't have any of the items listed above with you, but are registered to vote, you can fill out a provisional ballot and bring in proof of identity before the polls close, at which point, your vote will count the same as if you had provided identification at the time you voted. If you fill out a provisional ballot and do not bring in proof of identity, but your signature matches the signature on your voter registry, your vote will count.

None of these changes will affect absentee voters and anyone who doesn't have a Missouri state issued ID can go to any Driver's License bureau office and receive a non-driver voting identification for free. For more information, contact your local County Clerk's office or the Secretary of State's office.

Our next election will be August 8th and will involve a road & bridge tax, as well as electing someone to fill the seat in the 50th District which is currently vacant after the posting of Caleb Jones to Governor Greiten's administrative team. If you are not registered yet, you must register by July 12th to vote in that election.

When Brianna was finished sharing this information, she drew for our Attendance drawing. Cody Hackmann will be at breakfast next week, but his number was the first one drawn today. Kyle Baker and Jennifer Zagorac had their chance also, but now the pot will have a chance to grow.
