I was informed of a correction that needed to be made to last week's bulletin. The original bulletin read:

The Optimist International Foundation was also able to provide \$246,164 to Clubs utilizing the Club Campaign program, where Clubs borrow money from the OI Foundation to start new programs, which the Club then pays back.

This is incorrect. The Club Campaign allows clubs that do not have 501(c)(3) status to route funds for a project through the Optimist International Foundation so that donors can receive tax-exempt status for their donations. Once the necessary donation level is achieved for a campaign, the funds are released to the club. Optimist International Foundation does not loan money to clubs. Clubs must present a proposal, including the funding amount that is needed for the project before the Foundation will approve a Club Campaign to be set up. I regret any confusion this may have caused.
