Our speaker this morning was Nora Dietzel, Boone County Recorder of Deeds. She stepped up at the last minute when our intended speaker was not available. She came to talk about an important new program that the Boone County Recorder's office is offering to prevent land fraud.

To keep others from using your name in real estate transactions or business dealings, you can go to the Recorder's office to fill out paperwork or go to www.showmeboone.com/Recorder and register for their Deed Notification service. You can set up an account online with your email, which you will be required to verify through a link that you will be sent to that email address. Once it has been verified, a second email will be sent to you with a paper form, which must be filled out and signed in the Recorder's office or notarized if you want to mail it in. If a signed form is not received in their office within thirty days, your account will expire.

Once your account is set up, you can go into your account and set parameters, including any variations of your name or any nicknames that you want tracked. This is also a convenient way to check on the status of any properties that you have. If you aren't comfortable with email, you can also receive your information through regular postal mail.
