Bern Bonderer is coordinating the Red Kettle Campaign for the Ashland location again this year at Moser's. It started Nov. 22. This is his 14th year! Everything will be the same as in the past. If you would like to ring, please contact him at <u>bern.bonderer@twehous.com</u> or call 573-632-1919 to get more details. You may ring for 10 minutes or 10 hours! There is no set schedule, but he has to report all ringers and times to the Salvation Army so please do NOT just go over there and ring. Bern shared Friday that he has not had many ringers yet, so please get friends, church groups, or just consider helping.

The elementary basketball games are covered through the end of December, but will restart on January 6th, with games at the Primary and Middle schools. There will be two games at each school every Saturday through the middle of February and you can sign up for all day or just one game, but we need an adult available the entire time.

We held Bingo on Dec. 1st, with 107 players.

However we were able to make full payouts on the games after selling a horse race and eight additional games and still were able to make a deposit from the floor and the kitchen.

With President Leigh Kottwitz out of town this morning, Ken Bishop ran the meeting this morning, with Jim Green giving the invocation before we enjoyed the delicious breakfast provided by Chris Felmlee. Barrett Glascock shared that the missing tables are being used by the school for this weekend's wrestling tournament. He also shared a thank you card from the local 4H clubs for the donation we made toward this year's Recognition Night.

Our speaker this morning was Breanna Lennon, our Boone County Clerk, who started off by speaking about the upcoming Municipal Bond Election in Ashland on Feb. 6th for wastewater improvements. This is the first February bond issue election in Boone County since 1998. As a city bond issue, only residents of Ashland will be able to vote on this, it will be a paper only ballot, all hand counted, and the only polling location will be at our building as ways to save money.

The next event will be the Presidential caucuses in March, as Missouri has opted out of holding a statewide Presidential Primary. These will be handled by the county Central Committees of each party, so Brianna shared what information she had, but is still waiting on more details. What she does know is that the <u>Boone County Republican</u> caucus will be held Mar. 2nd at the Family Worship Center (4925 E Bonne Femme Rd. Columbia) and that the Boone County Democrats hope to hold their caucus as a mail-in during the month of February, with the final in-person meeting somewhere in Boone County on Mar. 23. Following that, the local municipal elections will be held on April 2nd. The State primaries will be held in August, and the general election will be Nov. 5th.

Breanna touched on the Senior Property tax change that could be on the August ballot and talked about the photo ID legislation which is currently under discussion. One issue with repealing the photo ID legislation is that the two week no excuse absentee voting is on the same legislation. For more information on what is on your ballot, what ID is allowed for voting, and where to vote, you can go to the Boone County Clerk's website: <u>showmeboone.com</u>.

Once Breanna was finished sharing her information and answering questions, she drew for the Attendance drawing. Skip Wells, Cameron Burns, and Terry Wren missed their chance at riches, but with their absence, the pot will have a chance to grow.
