The parade turns south at Main Street and circles back to the Primary School, after which the tractors can continue down to The Meadows for the show.

In 2015, Rich and several of the other members of the Methodist Men's group from the Ashland Methodist Church, including Skip Wills, Chad Robinson, Robert Diederich, Wayne Freeman, Frank Miller, and Jeff Conley, were trying to come up with a use for their new property, The Meadows at 16535 Old 63 South.
