The Ashland Optimist Board of Directors met on Thursday, July 13th, at the Optimist building. Financial records for May and June were shared, along with a report about the recent Fishing Clinic and Arcie Sapp Blood drive. Thanks were extended to Bruce Glascock for filling in the large pothole that had been at the corner of Henry Clay and Optimist Dr. Jan Palmer has secured a booth for the Fall Festival on Sept. 9th and will be getting a banner. She will be looking for members to help staff the booth from 9-4. The Board ended the meeting by accepting Bill DiPietro as a new member. He was sponsored by Ernie Wren.

After a breakfast including breakfast burritos and zucchini bread prepared by Dana Cafourek and I, Leigh introduced our speakers, Alec Mundle and Jennifer Clark-Williams from Boone County Health and Senior Services. They brought their Health on Wheels van and shared information about some of the programs they provide around Boone county using the van. One is preventative health checks for prediabetes, blood pressure, and other health issues, with no insurance needed. This allows people to find a location/event near them to start the process of addressing their health problems.

Another program is called Healthy

Heart Ambassador Blood Pressure Self-Monitoring. Participants are provided a blood pressure cuff, plus two consultations with a Community Health Worker per month for four months to help train them on how to use the blood pressure cuff correctly and follow up with them about blood pressure concerns, as well as monthly nutrition seminars for long term health.

After Alec and Jennifer shared their information and answered questions, but before everyone headed outside to tour the van, Alec drew for the Attendance drawing. Madeline Bloss was thrilled to hear her number and responded with "It pays to attend!"
