Basketball will continue through the end of February, and after the first of the year we will have games at two locations so we need your help! As Barrett suggested, we can divide up the days in 3-4 hour shifts to make this more manageable. We should have an adult there at all times. The Evening Social at Jose' Jalapenos had thirty-one people, including several people who were interested in possibly joining the Ashland Optimist Club. We hope to do another evening social in February, possibly as a carry-in dinner.

The Veteran's Breakfast on Nov. 11th allowed us to feed 150 veterans and their families. Thank you to Missy Bonderer for coordinating this event and to everyone who helped out that morning!

The Ashland Optimist Board met on Thursday, Nov. 9th. They voted to allow the Saddle Club to put a booster on our wi-fi so that they can install cameras on their buildings to help with their security. The Board discussed Madeline Blos' need for assistance for Youth Basketball, discussed the upcoming Veteran's Breakfast on Nov. 11th, and Shawn Steelman was kind enough to volunteer his mother, Bev Steelman to head up Pancake Day on Feb. 3rd. 2024.

The Board also approved the purchase of a floor scrubber to help our cleaning folks, approved upgrades including new toilets in the bathrooms and blinds for the Board room, approved a donation to the Hartsburg Legion Auxiliary for flags at the Southern Boone School buildings, and approved Jori Sullivan as a new member.

On Nov. 17th, our club provided Bingo, with 157 players. We had good help on the floor, selling two horse races and six other event games, which allowed us to make a \$4,700 deposit, even after paying out \$1,199 for the top game. The kitchen had an excellent crew as well, with a deposit of over \$1,000.

We had two guests this morning: Taylor Elliott, who has helped with the Veteran's Breakfast for the past three years and has turned in a membership application, and Jori Sullivan, who just became a member and was our speaker this morning.

Bruce Glascock thanked everyone who helped at this year's rodeo before he provided financial statements from this year's rodeo, along with a check for \$31,246.

After President Leigh Kottwitz introduced Jori, she left to help cover for the first morning of our Youth Basketball program (see information above). Jori moved here from Oregon a year ago to work with Von Prost of Jefferson City on his Prost Foundation. There are three parts that they are working on.

Part 1: The Way to Happiness- a common sense guide to better living (<u>www.thewaytohappinessint.org</u>) with guidance from a moral code. Part 2: The Truth About Drugs (<u>drugfreeworld.org</u>)

Part 3: The Story of Human Rights (humanrights.com)

They are also working on providing information about sex trafficking and commercial exploitation related to the internet.
