Our speakers this morning were Kelley and Andy

Upton with the Columbia Chapter of Sleep in Heavenly Peace, a 501(c)(3) non-profit that builds and delivers beds to children, ages 3-17, who have no bed of their own. The program was started in 2012 by Luke Middleton in Idaho and now has 355 chapters throughout the United States and Canada. Kelley and Andy got involved through their church, Community United Methodist earlier this year, but they believe this is a program for the whole community. They discovered that 50% of students in Columbia qualify for free of reduced-price meals and that 16% of students live in extreme poverty. It only cost \$250 to build a bed, with a mattress and

bedding, and Sleep in Heavenly Peace has some fabulous sponsors, including Lowe's, Ashley, and Serta. Our local chapter is looking for people to donate pillows and bedding, plus possibly sponsor a bed build, which would provide a number of beds that the group decides on, with enough donations and volunteers to build those beds in four hours. Two volunteers are required for each bed in the goal amount and there would be eleven stations for all interests, including cutting, sanding, branding, and staining in a white vinegar bath. They are also looking for funds to sponsor the beds and people to help deliver them. One special need that they have is for IBC totes that they can use for the vinegar stain. They are hoping to start in the 65202 zip code area
