According to Barrett Glascock, the 180 players we had at Bingo on Friday night was the biggest crowd we've had in years. We had great help on the floor, where three horse races and eleven other games were sold, leading to a deposit of \$7,265 (\$4,765 above the original bank) and in the kitchen, with a deposit of \$1,202.

After a delicious breakfast of all our regular fare, plus French vanilla cream doughnuts from this morning's speakers, Brooke & Jared Thomassen who own Heart of the Home Bakery here in Ashland.

They currently work out of their home, which is handy since they have two young daughters. They can also offer special orders with advance notice but hope to have a storefront location eventually.
