We hosted Bingo on Friday, Oct. 18 for a \$1,199 night, with 140 players. The floor brought in \$2,100 and the kitchen had plenty of help, with a deposit of \$877. Thank you to everyone who helped!

Because the special breakfast that Bern Bonderer and Robert Blake made for us this morning took longer than they expected, we allowed our speaker, Emilee Lenz with the Southern Boone PTA, to go before breakfast was served. Emilee moved to the area last year and wanted to get involved with PTA, because she has a number of family members who have been involved with PTA in the past. She volunteered to be Treasurer because they needed a treasurer before they could offer any services or do any fundraising. Southern Boone PTA services all four buildings, which means the few volunteers they have are stretched thin. When Emilee originally joined, there were normally only 5-6 members at meetings, with 74 dues paying members. The PTA started this year with 22 dues paying members, but through a membership drive competition, they now have 131 members. They still need to fill several of the Officer and Committee Chair positions, but realize that it is hard for people to add things to our schedules. Meetings are normally on the first Thursday of the month at 6:30 p.m. in the Primary building, with dues only \$10 for the year.
